Dr Janin completed his basic medical training from the University of Liège in Belgium. After receiving postgraduate training at various hospitals in Belgium and Sydney, he was accredited as a specialist in anaesthetics by the University of Liège, and a specialist in intensive care medicine by the College of Intensive Care Medicine of Australia and New Zealand and the University of Liège.

Dr Janin is an expert in continuous renal replacement therapy using citrate, echocardiography and critical care ultrasound, transcranial doppler, critical care infectious disease, point-of-care coagulation testing, extra-corporeal membrane oxygenation, and hypnosis. Moreover, he is actively involved in local clinical activities as a clinical committee member of Blood Transfusion Management and Massive Transfusion Guidelines at the Northern Sydney Local Health District (NSLHD) and Antimicrobial Stewardship at the Royal North Shore Hospital.
