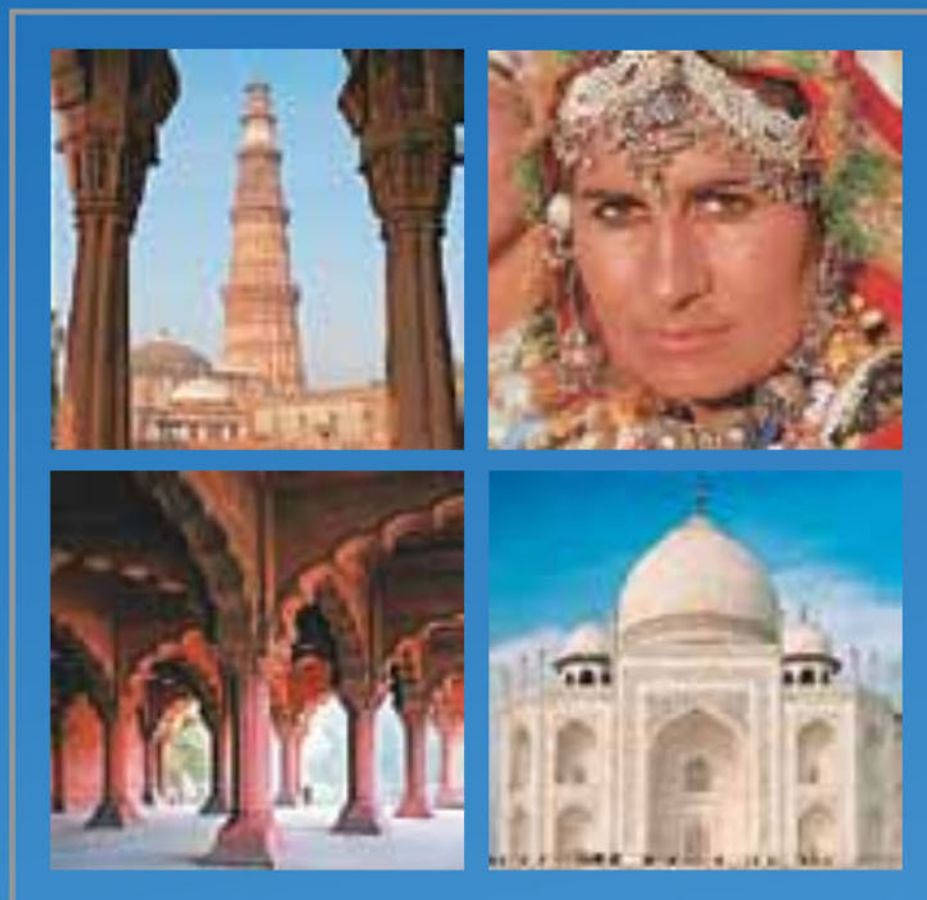

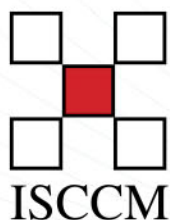

Post-Congress Workshops & Courses

February 19-21, 2011

Advanced Cardiac Life Support Provider Course (2 ½ Days) ACLS - 01

Designed by The American Heart Association USA, the course focuses on training the healthcare providers to deal with cardiac arrest or other cardiopulmonary emergencies. Realistic simulations reinforce the following key concepts: proficiency in basic life support care; recognizing and initiating early management of peri-arrest conditions; managing cardiac arrest; identifying and treating ischemic chest pain and acute coronary syndromes; recognizing other life-threatening clinical situations (such as stroke) and providing initial care; ACLS algorithms; and effective resuscitation team dynamics.

After completion of the course, based on the evaluation the successful participants will be awarded with AHA Certification.

Fundamental Critical Care Support Course (2 Days) FCCS - 02

Fundamental Critical Care Support Course is developed under the auspices of Society of Critical Care Medicine, USA. The FCCS course is a standardized 2 days course that is conducted in 25 countries all over the world. This is an ideal training course for Primary care physicians, Emergency medicine physicians, Critical Care Fellows, Residents, and Physicians etc. The course consists of standardized 16 lectures referenced to syllabus material plus 7 interactive skill stations and pre & post assessment test.

A SCCM certificate will be awarded to individuals who score over 70% in the post test.

Fundamental Disaster Management Course (1 Days) FDM - 03

The FDM course is prepared under the direction of the Society of Critical Care by leading multi-professional Critical Care educators with expertise in disaster preparedness. The aim of this course is to prepare health care professionals to treat victims of natural or man made mass casualty events. Upon completion of FDM, participants should be better able to provide life-sustaining critical care to critically ill or injured victims of chemical inhalations, conventional explosions, natural disasters, epidemics, radiological exposures, structure fires and large scale disasters.

Advanced Trauma Life Support (3 Days) ATLS - 04

ATLS course is developed by The American college of Surgeons to train doctors for early care of trauma patients. This course presents a concise approach to assessing and managing multiple injured patients. The course is vital to guide the care of the injured patient in emergency department trauma rooms. The course training provides a common language that can save lives in critical situations. They will also be able to resuscitate and stabilize the patient according to priority. Determine if the patient's needs exceed a facility's capacity & arrange appropriately for the patient's inter-hospital transfer and also assure that optimum care is provided to them.

Ultrasound in Emergency and Critical Care Unit (2 Days) UECC - 05

This is an International course designed by WINFOCUS (World Interactive Network Focusing on Emergency and Critical Care Ultra-Sound) providing competences in point-of-care Critical Ultrasound. The faculty from WINFOCUS will train delegates in using Ultrasound according to 'ABCDE' and 'Head-to-toes' priority pathways in order to enhance rapid and effective decision making in triaging, diagnosing, treating, and monitoring acute and critical patients. The course will broadly cover general principles of ultrasound, how to interpretate the ultrasound patterns of the major severely acute syndromes, and the guidance technique of the major invasive procedures. The delegates will also have hands on practice sessions so as to make them comfortable to use ultrasound in critical care services.

Contemporary Approaches to Mechanical Ventilation (2 Days) MV - 06

Well known international experts, in field of mechanical ventilation will conduct this workshop. They will update participants on the current state-of-the-art thinking on mechanical ventilation. Specifically the course will cover basic principles and modes of mechanical ventilation, recent advances in the evidence-based strategies of mechanical ventilation in different clinical scenarios and newer technologies. The participants will also get the opportunity to interact with experts during the hands on session.

Hemodynamic Monitoring & Echo-cardiography in Critically Ill Patients (2 Days) HMEC - 07

Hemodynamic monitoring is an invaluable tool used routinely in management of critically ill patients. During this workshop various invasive and non invasive techniques of hemodynamic monitoring and Cardiac output measurement like CVP, Arterial pressure and PA pressure monitoring, Pulse Contour Analysis, Echo-cardiography & Doppler will be discussed.

Critical Care Nursing Update (2 Days) CCN - 08

The world of critical care nursing practice is rapidly changing and evolving. The workshop will feature a program to challenge all advanced practice nurses into new ways of thinking and delivering health care in the field of Critical Care Medicine.

The aim of the workshop is to bring together nurses from a range of clinical settings and locations both internationally and locally to examine the challenges and complexities of managing critical illness through evidence based practice to maximize the quality of life of patients and their families.

This workshop will cover topics like ABC of resuscitation, Airway management, Arrhythmia recognition, Haemodynamic monitoring, Familiarity with ventilators, Infection control practices, Stoma care, Drugs & Procedures in ICU, Care of invasive devices, Record keeping and many more.

Post-Congress Workshops & Courses

Basic Pediatric Intensive Care (1 Day)

BPIC - 09

The Course has been designed to update the delegates about the recent advances in Paediatric Intensive Care and how they can apply this knowledge into their day-to-day practice. This course comprises of didactic lectures and skill stations. Some of the salient contents of this course are: how to recognize a sick child in emergency room, how to manage a Child with Neurologic Injury, Principles of Analgesia and sedation in PICU, Antibiotics and antifungals management in PICU, PICU Procedures, Airway management and adjuncts, how to setup a ventilator, Shock & its management, Fluid therapy and electrolyte abnormalities, Nutrition issues in PICU, Blood component therapy in PICU, Transport of sick children and many more.

Antibiotic Stewardship & Infection Control (1 Day)

ASIC - 10

The goal of this workshop is to raise awareness about the escalating problem of antimicrobial resistance. The participants will be enlightened by the eminent faculty about rational use of antibiotics, how to deal with multidrug resistant organisms, PK-PD of antibiotics, how to develop antibiotic protocols as per local ICU fora and how to prevent and control nosocomial infections in the Hospital.

Advanced Airway Management Workshop (2 Days)

AAM - 11

The workshop will commence with a series of talks and demonstrations that detail various situations in which an airway cannot be established through conventional means including a discussion of appropriate methods and tools that can be used in difficult airway management. This will be followed by a hands-on training session featuring flexible, rigid, malleable and digital optical devices, intubating stylets, supraglottic airways and invasive airways on mannequins to further sharpen and refresh their skills.

Managing Crisis as a Team – Learning through Simulations (1 Day)

MCT - 12

Patient simulator “A Real-life” medical experience

With the use of state of art high fidelity human simulator, the participants will get an hands on opportunity to manage critical care case scenarios, not only as an individual but as a team. The scenarios are designed to provide a real life like crisis situations commonly seen in critical care units.



Bronchoscopy in ICU (1 Day)

BRC - 13

The objective of this one day workshop is to train the intensivists in the basics of diagnostic and therapeutic bronchoscopy with a special emphasis on safety of the patients and care of the equipments. The workshop will include Lectures, Live Demonstration of Bronchoscopic Procedures from ICU and Hands on Training.

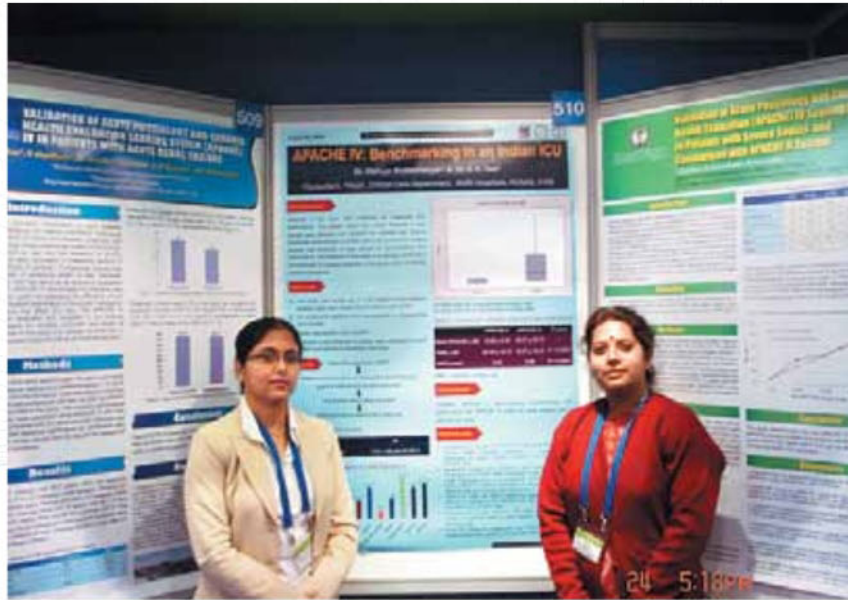

(anidulafungin IV)

100 mg anidulafungin powder for solution for infusion

Indications: Treatment of invasive candidiasis, including candidemia & esophageal candidiasis in adult patients.

Contraindications: Hypersensitivity to the active substance, or to any of the excipients. Hypersensitivity to other medicinal products of the echinocandin class (e.g., Caspofungin).

Warning and Precautions: The infusion rate should not exceed the recommended infusion rate of 1.1 mg/minute. Laboratory abnormalities in liver function tests have been seen in healthy subjects and patients treated with anidulafungin. Clinically significant hepatic abnormalities have occurred in patients with serious underlying medical conditions who were receiving multiple concomitant medications along with anidulafungin. Isolated cases of significant hepatic dysfunction, hepatitis, or worsening hepatic failure have been reported in patients; a causal relationship to anidulafungin has not been established. Patients who develop abnormal liver function tests during anidulafungin therapy should be monitored for evidence of worsening hepatic function and evaluated for risk/benefit of continuing anidulafungin therapy.

Adverse Reactions: Adverse events are typically mild to moderate and seldom led to discontinuation. Infusion-related adverse events have been reported with anidulafungin, including rash, urticaria, flushing, pruritus, dyspnea, and hypotension & can be minimized by infusing anidulafungin at a rate that does not exceed 1.1 mg/minute. Adverse events reported in the trials include thrombocytopenia, coagulopathy, hyperkalemia, hypokalemia, hypomagnesaemia, convulsions, headache, flushing, diarrhoea, raised liver enzymes, rash, pruritis, raised blood bilirubin & creatinine, prolonged QT interval.

Dosage: Invasive candidiasis, including candidemia, in adult patients - A single 200 mg loading dose on Day 1, followed by 100 mg daily thereafter. In general, antifungal therapy should continue for at least 14 days after the last positive culture. Esophageal candidiasis - A single 100 mg loading dose of anidulafungin on Day 1, followed by 50 mg daily thereafter.
