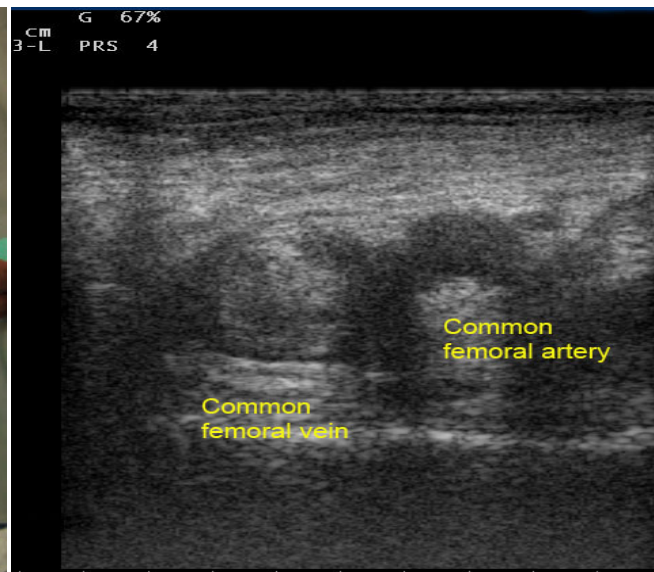
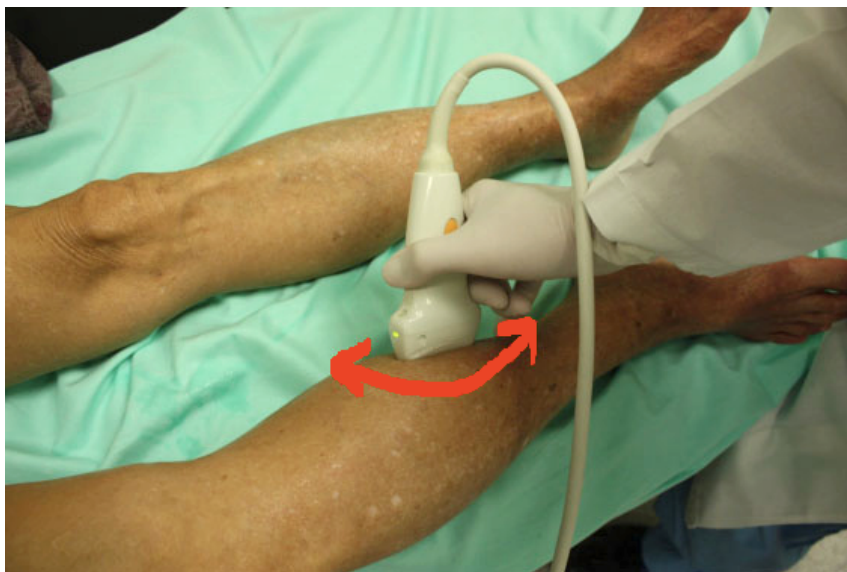


USG Guided Vascular Access & DVT course

Course

Venous Access is the bread and butter of the daily practice in emergency and critical care settings. However, even in the best hands, clinicians still often fail to establish venous access in difficult patients. Nowadays, ultrasound emerges as the best tools for clinicians to overcome the difficulty by providing real time guidance for venous access establishment. In patients with swollen legs, ultrasound can also provide clues to rule in/out the possibility of Deep Vein Thrombosis.

In this course, being the first one in Hong Kong, candidates would learn the principle of ultrasound guidance for central/peripheral vein access, and the clinical protocols and practical approaches to rule in/out Deep Vein Thrombosis through lectures, and practical sessions with human models, animal models and phantoms. A manual will be provided to participants and a MCQ test would be arranged at the end of the workshop.
